



September Program:

My First Thirty Years of Mineral Collecting

**by Ray Berry
Colorado Springs**



Ray Berry, longtime Colorado mineral collector and member of Friends of Mineralogy as well as the Colorado Springs Mineralogical Society, will describe, in words and pictures, his collecting experiences. Ray has been an active collector in the Pikes Peak batholith over the decades, uncovering numerous pockets of smoky quartz, amazonite, bladed goethite, topaz, and cleavelandite. Some of these specimens have won awards at the Denver Gem and Mineral Show™, the Pikes Peak Gem and Mineral Show, and RMFMS and AFMS Shows. His “Mesabi” pegmatite mining claims have been particularly noteworthy for their occurrence of well-crystallized goethite associated with smoky quartz and amazonite, sometimes as sprays on the quartz, sometimes as “onegite” inclusions within smoky to amethystine quartz. Ray will describe his first thirty years of collecting in Colorado as dated from 1970, when the very first specimen he saved began his collection, with notes from his digging experiences. His talk will illustrate many of his best specimens and describe how they were collected.
