Field Trip September 6-8 Lead by Jack Murphy: Colorado Geology: Train, Tram, and Quarry Greetings. I would like to inform you of a field trip I am leading the weekend before the Denver Gem and Mineral Show. The trip leaves Denver Saturday Sept. 6 on the Amtrak train and proceeds to Glenwood Springs. From there on motor coach to historic Hotel Colorado next to the hot springs pools. A tour of the Glenwood Caverns later in the day is followed by a special dinner at the new restaurant up at the cave looking across a panorama of western Colorado. The next day Sunday Sept. 7 we take a 4wheel drive tour to the Yule Marble quarry and to the ghost town of Crystal. Back to the Hotel Colorado and hot springs. On Monday the 8th we take the motor coach up to Gilman Mining District and the site of the Eagle Mine--this years Denver Gem & Mineral Show theme (the show is Sept. 12-14). Then on to Leadville for lunch and a tour of the National Mining Hall of Fame & Museum and the new Eagle mine walk-through pyrite diorama made from crystals that I collected in the early 1980s before the mine closed. Then back to Denver Monday afternoon arriving about 5 pm.
