Jack Murphy Curator of Geology, Denver Museum of Nature and Science will present a Tour and Stories about the Coors Mineral Hall

For our November meeting program, Jack Murphy will lead a personal tour of the Coors Mineral Hall. Jack will tell some interesting "behind-the-scenes" stories about the history of specimens, construction of the special exhibits, some items on display, and history of the mineral hall in general. We may also take a quick look in the Geology Department area upstairs to see or hear about some of the newer acquisitions. Jack will also give some background information about just what goes on in the Geology Department and how specimens are curated.

The Museum Trophy was well received and won by the New Mexico Museum of Natural History for their "Minerals in Medicine" display. Attendance was strong with a total of 8,251 paid admissions.
