2006 FMCC Auction

The Colorado Chapter of the Friends of Mineralogy will hold its annual silent auction on May 20th at the Clements Community Center located at 1580 Yarrow (near Colfax and Wadsworth) in Lakewood, Colorado, from 1:00 to 3:00 P.M. This auction features reasonably priced minerals, faceted stones, books, and mining paraphernalia to the general public. There will be a special verbal auction at 2:00 P.M. of museum quality specimens donated by special dealers. As reminders: 1.Bidding increment remains 25-cents, 2.We always need extra help on auction day, especially cashiers or readers, 3.Please sign up May 11 to bring finger foods, verbal auction donations, and to volunteer on the 20th.

A special invitation is extended to non-FM members to participate in this auction as buyers and/or sellers. All sellers are requested to pre-register by phoning Jim Hurlbut (303-757-0283). All interested sellers and buyers are invited to phone Bruce Geller at 303-237-2947 for further details.

The average sales price for the 193 items auctioned last year was \$5.50. Seventeen different sellers successfully sold items in the two-hour period. That means the materials selling from our tables can't be beat! There is virtually no limit on the amount of materials that any seller can set out at our auction. Set up time for dealers is roughly noon. Dealers, completely fill out your bid slips and try to make your opening bids reasonable, or you'll take home most of what you're trying to sell.

Bidding will start at 1:00 P.M. Tables will be closed randomly, beginning with two tables at 1:40 P.M.; then roughly two tables at a time every 10 minutes thereafter. Our small verbal auction of quality materials will commence at about 2:00 P.M. We hope this is our best auction ever! -- Bruce Geller
