September Program:

Bruce Geller and Aaron Rever will speak on The Study and Display of Fluorescent Specimens

Fluorescent minerals have been known for well over a century. The emission of light from minerals and other materials originates <u>within</u> the materials and is not a surface phenomenon. Slight impurities called "activators" are the accepted causes of fluorescence in minerals, and other impurities known as "poisons" inhibit fluorescence. Some materials take fluorescence a step further by emitting light after the stimulating irradiation is removed – they phosphoresce. More rarely, certain materials change their color in visible light after they are exposed to ultraviolet irradiation – they tenebresce.

A demonstration of fluorescence will highlight minerals and common household items that display the property well. Some of the more commonly fluorescent minerals will be irradiated in order to show their ultraviolet reactions, phosphorescence, and least commonly, tenebrescence. Discussions on displaying fluorescent minerals and ultraviolet lamps will end the evening.

Bruce Geller has studied fluorescent minerals for almost 40 years and is the director of the Colorado School of Mines Museum. Aaron Rever is a geologist who has studied fluorescent minerals for many years and works in the Denver offices of Schlumberger.








Theft Alert - Collector's Edge Specimens

Sadly, there has been another major theft of mineral specimens! The Garden of the Gods Visitors Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado suffered a break-in in the early morning hours of Thursday, August 16th. Thieve(s) smashed through glass entry doors and proceeded to display cases in the Visitor's Center which contained a temporary exhibit of mineral specimens on loan from the Collector's Edge. The thieves smashed the glass display cases and stole 29 pieces of crystallized and nugget gold, a faceted Sweet Home Mine rhodochrosite gemstone, and a Sweet Home Mine rhodochrosite polished rhombohedron. The gold specimens were primarily from Siberian localities, but the missing pieces also include specimens from California, Alaska, Nevada, and Venezuela. 



Science and nature writing is a popular genre of contemporary literature, offering endless opportunities for craft, creativity, and publication. Learn to write clearly and effectively about science and nature. This class is for anyone wishing to learn about science and nature writing. This course introduces you to the fundamentals of science and nature writing and includes the process of writing a single piece of science and nature writing. The workshop includes tips on: finding and developing story ideas (hikes, stargazing, fossil hunts, etc.); discovering the difference between a subject and a story; outlining and structuring stories; strategies for opening and structuring stories; research strategies; choosing a narrative voice and strategy, crafting leads and making transitions between your story and its larger contexts; and discovering the role of the editor in publication.

This is also a perfect class for teachers. With all the state standards and other competencies required of students, writing is an essential skill. This workshop approaches the subject in a clear and accessible manner that provides science-rich, student-centered learning experiences. Taught by experienced practitioners, this class will be a valuable asset for anyone interested in integrating inquiry-based science and literacy strategies in their classrooms, informal education programs, or for their own use. A certificate of completion will be awarded. Formal scientific writing will also be covered. What others have said about the workshop . .
