The Cresson Mine, Cripple Creek, Colorado

The Cresson mine is Colorado's largest, and at the present time only, active gold mine. This large open pit mine occupies the site once partly covered by the old waste dumps from historic operation of the Cresson mine, and the pit floor still lies many hundreds of feet above the location of the rich and famous "Cresson Vug". David Vardiman will speak about the geology, minerals, and past and present mining of this famous deposit.

Did you know that a bill is being introduced in the Colorado State Legislature this week, to designate **Rhodochrosite** the Colorado State Mineral? This proposal has developed very quickly; it was initiated by the students in the earth science class of Jon Ghist, at Platte Canyon High School, Bailey, Colorado. A bill is being co-sponsored by State Rep. Carl Miller and State Senator Ken Chlouber. As this newsletter goes to press, the bill, HB 1346, will be heard in the House Agriculture Committee on Wednesday, Feb. 27. Bryan and Katherine Lees, State Geologist Vicki Cowart, and Jack Murphy are among those who are expected to testify in support of the bill. Colorado has a State Gemstone (aquamarine) and a State Fossil (Stegosaurus), but as of this time, no state mineral (or state rock). We are told that microcline or amazonite had been suggested as a state mineral at one time in the past, but the proposal never caught general interest. Possibly by the time you read this, our state mineral will have become official.

Some new publications:


Back in our August 2001 newsletter I listed some USGS and CGS publications on Colorado geology that might be of interest to members; one was a geologic map of the Silverton and Howardsville quadrangles, USGS Map I-2681. Another new publication on the San Juans is "Geochronology and geology of Late Oligocene through Miocene volcanism and mineralization in the western San Juan Mountains, 2001, USGS Prof. Paper 1642, 30 p., by Dan Bove, Ken Hon, Karin Budding, John Slack, Lawrence Snee, and Ross Yeoman. Also, USGS Circular 1219, which has the imposing title "Planning for the conservation and development of infrastructure resources in urban areas—Colorado Front Range Urban Corridor", by the USGS Front Range Infrastructure Resources Project, Daniel H. Knepper, editor, 2002, has a very good summary, with photos, maps, and diagrams, of the mineral, energy, and water resources of the metro Denver area. This publication is FREE upon request from the USGS.
