IN MEMORIUM: GEORGE FISHER

On March 29, 1999, a well-known Colorado field collector, George Fisher, passed away after a long bout with cancer.

George and his wife Betty have actively collected minerals from Mexico and Alaska and throughout the Rocky Mountains. Of the many trophies he won for his mineral displays, on of his most notable was the AFMS trophy for self-collected minerals.

George served as President of the Colorado Springs Mineralogical Society in 1969 and 1970. In large part, due to George's efforts, CSMS won the All-American Club Award in 1971. For his work, CSMS honored him with the club's Award of Merit in 1972. He also served as Colorado State Director to the Rocky Mountain Federation from 1979 to 1990, and was a member of F M C C. George was very active in his hobby and also gave much back to it. His most recent project was a statue of a prospector and his burro, to be placed at the intersection of Highway 24 and 21st Street in Colorado Springs. This statue will be dedicated on June 25, 1999, to honor: The Prospector of Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow.



TWO DAYS OF TALKS - BANQUET - FIELD TRIP

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION DEADLINE: JUNE 11, 1999

This symposium has been organized as a tribute to E. E. Foord. The meeting is scheduled to immediately precede the 1999 Denver Gem and Mineral Show, September 15 through 19. The symposium will address recent research and developments in the study of anorogenic pegmatites through a series of oral

presentations (and possibly posters) and a field excursion to visit NYF pegmatites in the Pikes Peak batholith.

Contributions to any aspect of mineralogy, petrology, geochemistry and classification of NYF-type pegmatites are solicited. Contributions concerning other types of pegmatites are also welcome.

Talks will be held at the Denver Museum of Natural History and are scheduled for Saturday September 11 and Sunday September 12.

A banquet and tribute to Gene Foord are planned for Saturday night September 11. Photos of Gene and comments or stories are solicited.

A field trip is planned for Monday September 13 and Tuesday September 14 to the NYF pegmatites of the Pikes Peak Batholith. The trip will include visits

to the South Platte district and the Lake George Amazonite pegmatite district.

The first day will be spent at the REE-rich South Platte pegmatites and the second day will include a visit to the Lake George area and an amazonite pegmatite. Participants will spend one night in a motel in Woodland Park. The trip

will return to Denver mid-afternoon September 14.

NOTE IMPORTANT CHANGE:

Abstracts of up to 250 words will be accepted. An abstract volume will be published PRIOR to the meeting in the Canadian Mineralogist. Note that this change makes the deadline submission firm. If authors desire, extended abstracts of up to two pages will still be accepted IN ADDITION to the 250 word

abstract. Extended abstracts will be distributed at the meeting. Only the $250\,$

word abstracts will be published by the Canadian Mineralogist.
