

COLORADO MINERALS UPDATE--PROPOSED PHOTOGRAPHS: As work on the update of Minerals of Colorado approaches its final stages, there are several areas in which members of the chapter can help expedite the work being done by the authors. One such area is the selection of photographs to be included in the book. To this end, John and Barbara Muntyan have prepared a tentative list of mineral species for which it would be desirable to have photographs in the book. Their list was presented at the past (March) FM board meeting; it contains 62 suggested photographs, including several different mineral habit or locality combinations for some mineral species. We still don't have a firm estimate of how many total photographs, and how many color photographs, it will be feasible to include in the book.
